Registration and material fee **CHF 500.00** (to be paid once)

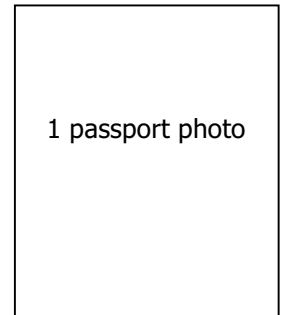
Tuition fee per academic year (all inclusive package) **CHF 8'640.00**

To be paid in advance of each month = 9 times CHF 960.00 (yearly payment in advance: 2% discount)

The „all inclusive package“ includes (5 years at CHF 8640.00 each): all mandatory courses (including pediatrics), course material, clinical days, lunch, examinations fees. Support for the proposal and thesis to get the title Osteopath D.O. (followed after the 5 years) During the 5 years of study you are allowed to repeat courses for free (we only charge you for the lunch).

Additional costs:

Accommodation: Single room, incl. breakfast+dinner: CHF 85.00 – CHF 103.00 / Double room, incl. breakfast+dinner: CHF 69.00 – CHF 84.00 / additional books: about CHF 200 per academic year / not mandatory courses / Costs for additional anatomy if needed



General Conditions

Application

- Upon receipt of the application, the registration fee becomes due. The application is binding; acceptance to the programme is decided by the school management. You will receive a confirmation of registration along with an invoice for the registration fee.
- Should the programme or course already be fully booked, you will be informed immediately.

Registration Fee

- The registration fee for the programme is due with the acceptance of the application and is not refunded.
- There is no registration fee for additional courses.

Course leave or suspension notice

Cancellations or postponements are only possible in writing. The date of receipt is deemed to be a valid for the termination or suspension of the course.

Venue

Miscellaneous

- The course material (scripts, worksheets, etc.) is included in the course fee.
- The books recommended by the lecturers are not included.

Insurance

Terms of payment
